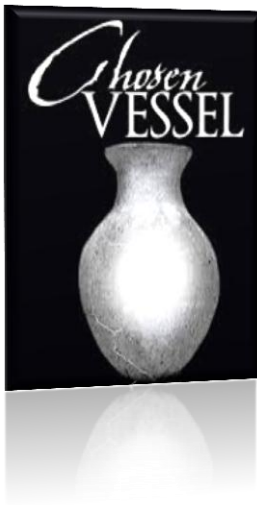
“Chosen Vessel”

Jesus chose to be born in the manger in utter poverty and die on the cross—a most humiliating death. God the Father chose Mary to be that vessel which could carry His word and manifest to the world, Father’s preferential love for humanity. Mary was chosen among many. We have a long list of chosen people in the O.T. and N.T. Abraham, Moses, Isaiah, Joshua, David, Apostles, Paul, Mother Eliswa and today you and me.

Every choice separates it from the whole. In the Holy Eucharist Chalice is a chosen vessel which is set apart for a special purpose. Jesus was chosen Son of the Father to be the redeemer of the world. Mary was set apart to become the co-redeemer of the world. Abraham was chosen to be the father of faith. Moses was chosen from his birth to be the liberator of his people. Peter was chosen to be the rock on which He would build His church. Paul was chosen to preach to the gentiles. Our holy Mother St. Teresa was chosen among many nuns in the cloister to reform the Carmelite Order. Mother Eliswa was chosen to be the prophetess of 19th century to be the voice of women flock.



In all this choice what is to be focused is that the vessel is chosen not because of its worth or ability but it’s the Master wishes to choose this particular one in spite of all its unworthiness, its brokenness, its frugality and earthiness.

Master Wishes To choose and that’s what happened in the life of our beloved Foundress Mother Eliswa. After the death of Vareed her husband Mother Eliswa lay aside just like the clay vessel, not expecting to be made whole.
